### **DOC Concession Renewals**

Web Administrator Angela D'Aquaro has loaded the ACTIVITY RETURN FORM for 24-25 on the website - **Everything DOC** section - so that every concessionaire can fill their individual return and send it back to ProGuides in their own time. However, please make sure to send it **by 1 July at the latest.** If you have any questions, please contact **Angela.**<u>A few key notes</u>: the current DOC concession is valid to 30 June 2025 (same as the ProGuides membership). You will need to reapply for 25-26 if you wish to retain the concession, the application is on the "Everything Doc" section on our website.

Once you have sent us your activity return (doc@proguides.co.nz), you will receive an invoice based on your declaration. Note that **you must send a return** even if you haven't used the concession, in that case NIL. We suggest you send the return + the new DOC application at the same

time, but the new concession will only be issued after all dues are paid.

# **Turbocharging Tourism**

A major drive boosting New Zealand as an international travel destination will kick off with a NZ\$ 13.5 million turbocharge for global marketing activity. The initial investment would focus on encouraging visitors from China, Australia, the US, India, Germany and South Korea. Hospitality NZ believes that the investment will make a positive impact.

## **Visitor numbers**

Overseas visitor arrivals were down in February compared to the same time last year. Statistics NZ recorded 354.400 arrivals in the month, a decrease of 8400 from February 2024. However, there were substantial increases in visitors from the US, Australia and the UK.
